Grace Notes

This month, we begin a new newsletter series called, "Ask the Pastor." The goal of this series is to answer the questions that you have about the Christian faith. That means that I'm going to need YOUR help. Submit whatever questions you have had about what our belief and practice as Lutherans: "Why do we kneel for Communion? Is cremation OK for Christians? Who wrote the Apostles' Creed?" As you think of a question, give it to me in some manner of writing so that I don't forget: put it in my box at church, e-mail it to me, or text it to me. I'd also ask that you write your name on your question. That will simply allow me to follow up with you to clarify the question, if needed; I won't publish your name in the newsletter.

To start the series, I'll answer a question that often comes up in adult instruction classes, a question that you may have been asked by your non-Lutheran Protestant friends and family: "Why do you baptize infants?" That's a good question!

The best place to start is the place where Jesus starts; that's a good practice not only for answering questions about Baptism, but for all topics of the Christian faith. Jesus' words of institution for Holy Baptism are found at the end of Matthew's gospel. Jesus saiy, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:18-20). When Jesus institutes Holy Baptism, He tells us precisely who we are to baptize: all nations. Who is excluded from those words? No one! Jesus tells His church that anyone and everyone is a candidate for Holy Baptism. It does not matter if a person is a man or a woman, a Gentile or a Jew, a 99-year-old or a 9-day old—all nations are to be baptized!



If that seems strange or impossible to us, just consider the rest of Jesus' words. Before He institutes Holy Baptism, Jesus says that He has absolutely all authority. After He institutes Holy Baptism, Jesus says He will be with His disciples always. Therefore, when Jesus tells His church to go and make disciples by baptizing and teaching, there's absolutely no doubt that He will accomplish that task through these means, even for infants, because He will be with His church with all authority in heaven and on earth.

The rest of Holy Scripture confirms te inclusion of infants in Holy Baptism. Jesus regularly welcomed infants and children when they were brought to them, even saying to His disciples: "Let the children come to me; do not hinder them for to such belongs the kingdom of God. Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it" (Mark 10:14-15). The Bible also teaches that even infants are sinners (Psalm 51:5); therefore, they need the forgiveness and salvation that Baptism gives (Acts 2:38-39; 1 Peter 3:21). Finally, infants can indeed be given saving faith that receives Holy Baptism. If an infant can have faith that trusts that he can nurse only when he is with his mother, then that same infant can also have faith that trusts in Jesus Christ as Savior. In fact, Holy Scripture reminds us that even unborn children can have faith-John the Baptizer leapt in the womb at the presence of Jesus in Mary's womb (Luke 1:39-45)!

For these reasons, Lutherans baptize infants. In fact, it's really better to say that Lutherans baptize everyone—infants included! Anyone who has not received God's gift of Baptism is welcome to receive it, for it works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe!





CROSS CRAFT

Make this special cross as a reminder of Jesus' death and resurrection.



What you need:

- Adult help
- · Piece of wood
- 5 nails
- Hammer
- 2 balls of yarn (blue and yellow)

What you do:

- Hammer the nails into the wood to form a cross shape (see example).
- 2. Tie the blue yarn to the bottom nail. Wrap it up and around the top nail and back down to the bottom nail. Then wrap it around the middle nail and around the side nails. Repeat until the yarn is wrapped about halfway up the exposed nails.
- Repeat step two with the yellow yarn. Wrap it around the nails until only the heads are visible.

Rebuilding in India

November 30, 2018, a cyclone (hurricane) struck southern India. It's name was Ockhi (Oh-kee). It left its mark on India so that it's simply known as the Ockhi disaster.

Please forgive my tardy newsletter this month. I traveled to India with LCMS Disaster Response to record the damage done to the seminary of our partner church, the India Evangelical Lutheran Church (IELC).

Rev. Dr. Christu Das, principal of Concordia Theological Seminary in Nagercoil (CTSN) described the damage Ockhi left behind like a warzone.

Over forty trees on the thirteen acre campus were blown over. Roofs were destroyed. Because of the age of the buildings and extent of the damage, at least three buildings were irreparably damaged by the storm.

LCMS Disaster Response has helped the seminary rebuild after the storm. So far, the seminary has repaired many of the damaged roofs, started repairing the road, fixed power lines and street lights, and much more.

That said, they still have a long way to go. Many of the buildings are quite old. They were made with unbaked clay bricks that you can break apart with your bare hands.

The chapel needed more repair than originally anticipated as well. The entire building needed to be rewired and roofed.

Despite the disaster left behind, however, the seminary students and faculty have grown closer together. Rev. Dr. Sam Thompson, a professor from the seminary, noted that the disaster shows the reality of sin, and yet they continue to see our Lord's hand of mercy. Creation has been corrupted by sin.

Not only has LCMS Disaster Response assisted the community, but the students and faculty have grown together as they worked to restore the campus so that classes could resume.

Please keep the students and faculty in your prayers as they continue to rebuild from the Ockhi disaster.
