2019

The season of the Church Year has changed. We've entered into the long season of Sundays after Pentecost, which lasts all the way through November. For the most part, the color of the paraments stays green, which reminds us of the growth that the Holy Spirit gives to us through the Word of God that we hear each and every week. There are festivals that occur during this long season on which the color and emphasis changes (such as St. Michael and All Angels, Reformation Sunday, and All Saints' Day). Although there are no such festivals during the month of July that we will observe here on a Sunday, there are festivals and commemorations this month that occur during the week. I'll point out three here for your devotional benefit during the month.

On July 6, the Church commemorates the prophet Isaiah. Isaiah is often considered the greatest of the writing prophets. His ministry to the southern kingdom, Judah, lasted for quite some time, from approximately 740-680 BC. Isaiah is well-known for his call into ministry, recorded in Isaiah 6, in which he is caught up into God's heavenly throne room and hears the seraphim crying out, "Holy! Holy! Holy!" Isaiah also often bears the title, "The Fifth Evangelist," because of the clarity with which he preaches the birth, death, and resurrection of Jesus, even 700 years before his birth. On July 6, I encourage you to read through passages such as Isaiah 6:1-8; Isaiah 9:1-6; and Isaiah 52:13-53:12 as you give thanks to God for this faithful preacher of Christ in the Old Testament.

On July 22, the Church remembers St. Mary Magdalene. In Luke 8:2, we learn that Jesus cast out seven demons from her. Mary Magdalene is listed throughout the Gospels as one of the many women who accompanied Jesus and served Him during His earthly ministry. She was one of the women who witnessed Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection and

had the privilege of carrying that news herself to Jesus' disciples. On July 22, I encourage you to read John 20:10-18, give thanks for the faithful testimony of Jesus' resurrection that Mary Magdalene carried to the disciples, and carry that news to someone in your own life who needs to hear it.

On July 25, the Church gives thanks for St. James the Elder. There are several men named James in the New Testament; the St. James we remember on this date is the son of Zebedee, the brother of John. James was a fisherman by trade before Jesus called him to follow Him as one of the Twelve. James and his brother John were known as "Sons of Thunder" (Mark 3:17), perhaps due to their bold words and requests of Jesus (see, for example, Luke 9:54-55). When the apostles are listed, James is regularly named along with his brother John and Peter as the three leaders of the group. Acts 12:1-2 records James' death by beheading at the hand of Herod Agrippa I; St. James the Elder was the first of Jesus' Twelve Apostles to die as a martyr. On July 25, I encourage you to read Matthew 4:18-22 or Mark 10:35-45 and give thanks for this forgiven sinner and faithful witness of the Savior even unto death.

These are only three of the festivals and commemorations that occur in the Church Year during the month of July. I encourage you to take a look at the full list, which can be found in *Lutheran Service Book*, pp. x-xiii. As you make use of these festivals and commemorations in your own devotional life, I pray that the Lord richly blesses you through the accounts and examples of these faithful men and women, saints whom He has forgiven by His blood.

Realizing the importance of supporting the development of the next generation of Christian Leaders in church work, LWML District mites will be used to provide academic scholarships for students pursuing their Director of Christian Education (DCE) degree.

National Mission Grant Bulletin Bytes:

This month we will not feature a new mission grant but will start with the August newsletter. 21 grants were adopted in Mobile, AL in the amount of \$2,100,000. (2019-2021.) A big challenge but one the LWML can complete. 25% of what Grace’s society receive for mites goes to National LWML and 75% to the Texas district. In the August meeting, Sharon Reinberg and Jean Miller will give a report about the convention. If you can’t wait that long, go to LWML.org website for highlights of the convention. There were 3,105 attendees at the convention, with 691 of them being 1st timers.
