

Grace Notes



As we continue to learn to pray from the Psalms, this month we turn to Psalm 100. This Psalm is short enough for us to consider here together one verse at a time. I'll put each verse in italics, followed by brief comments afterward.

Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth! Psalm 100 begins with a call to praise. Notice two things. First, God invites us to make a joyful noise. God is not as interested in our ability to carry a tune as much as He is interested in our joy. All that He has done for our salvation fills us with joy, and that joy overflows from our lips with a song and a shout and a noise. To put it simply: sing, dear Christians, sing! Second, our praises join the praises of all creation. Our joyful noise is joined to the joyful noises of the rustling trees, breaking waves, chirping birds, roaring lions, and more.

Serve the LORD with gladness! Come into his presence with singing! The joyful noise we make to the LORD happens throughout the week in our prayers and devotions, but it especially happens when we come together for the Divine Service. There, God serves us with His gift of forgiveness; we respond with glad service to Him in worship as we sing songs of thanksgiving in His saving presence.

Know that the LORD, he is God! It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. Our joyful noise and worship of the LORD stems from the fact that He is the only true God; no one else is worthy of our praises. Yet the joyful truth is not only that He is God. Even more, the joyful truth is that He is *my* God; He is *your* God; He is *our* God. He is our God because He is our Creator. He has given us life and sustains our lives. He is our God because He is our Redeemer. Though we had rebelled against Him in every kind of sin and evil, Christ has bought us back by His holy, precious blood so that we are His own people. This is no impersonal relationship; instead, Jesus is our Good Shepherd, and we are His flock. He cares for us with tender compassion and leads us with diligence our whole life long.

Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise! Give thanks to him; bless his name! Yet again the theme of joy in God's presence sounds forth from Psalm 100. Because Christ has covered us with His righteousness in Holy Baptism, we no longer need to fear approaching God. Instead, we delight to draw near to Him with our prayers, petitions, thanksgivings, and praises. Because our heavenly Father has blessed us in Christ, we bless His name by proclaiming to all people what He has done.

For the LORD is good; his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations. Psalm 100 closes with a familiar refrain; part of this verse is often used as prayer to return thanks to the LORD after a meal. The prayer is simple yet profound: "The LORD is good." All that He does is for our benefit; all that He does comes out of His love for us that never ends. Whatever God sends into our lives, we have the confidence that He does it out of His fatherly, divine goodness and mercy. We have that confidence because of God's faithfulness. When He makes a promise, He keeps it. This is the faith of every Christian in every generation past, this is the faith of every Christian now, and this will be the faith of every Christian in every generation to come.

As the superscription of Psalm 100 reminds us, truly this is a psalm for giving thanks. Our hearts and mouths are filled with joy for what God has done through Jesus. He brings us into His presence with singing, and He sends us from His presence with the Gospel on our lips to tell the world. God be praised!

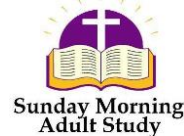

June ingathering - Texas District LWML Convention

LWML TEXAS DISTRICT GRANT BULLETIN BYTES:

The 42nd biennial Texas District Convention on June 16-18 was attended by 2 Grace members, Rose Pietsch and June Parker.

452 LWML members attended with a new mission goal of \$215,000 was adopted. One of them being Faith Lutheran High School-Warda for \$20,000. Offering during the convention to go to 3 groups totaled \$13,490.79. 3 new LWML groups were started in the last 2 years and our membership for Texas is 2513. Besides devotions, Bible studies, singing and many reports of the last two years there was much enjoyment meeting old friends and making new ones. It was a busy time but one that refreshed us in God's Word. Looking forward to the Corpus Christi convention in two years.

National Mission Grant Bulletin Bytes:

Redeeming Life Maternity Home, Illinois Expansion — \$100,000

Redeeming Life currently operates maternity and transitional homes in Central Florida for single pregnant women who are homeless, abused, and/or at-risk of abortion. It is a proven model. This grant will help Redeeming Life support a called deaconess to serve in a new location in the Chicagoland area. Additionally, the funds will help offset the costs, during the first two years, of operating a safe and stable home (rent, utilities, food) and provide program services for the women to be served. Redeeming Life's goal is for their residents to learn to live independently and offers many opportunities for the women to understand that, in Christ, there is forgiveness, peace, and unconditional love.
