



Ordinary Growth

The "ordinary time" of the church year that follows Pentecost and Trinity Sunday is characterized by growth, fruitfulness, and daily provision. Though the "ordinary green" of summer is seen week after week, it is far from mundane. What the world sees as mundane or simplistic, the Church sees as ordinary yet foundational and profoundly meaningful. This, in fact, is precisely how our Lord's ministry is characterized. The "mundane" touch, spit, words, and breath of Jesus are life-giving. The ordinary tasks of walking, talking, fishing, and eating are sanctified by His presence. And above all, His healings of physical ailments are bound together with his Word of forgiveness, life, and salvation. This is the kingdom of God! Ordinary, yet characterized by growth, fruitfulness, and daily provision.

One "ordinary" task that Jesus gives to the Church is the constant and earnest offering up of *prayers* that He would send men into the Office of the Holy Ministry. In Matthew 9, Jesus says to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore, pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." Though the timing is insignificant, it's fascinating to consider that the summer—the "ordinary time" of the church— is characterized by ordinations and installations. Amid the ordinary and seemingly mundane, the Church's prayers are answered. Men who have been prepared, examined, and called to be Pastors are sent out into the harvest with the Lord's blessing and promise of the Holy Spirit.

This indeed is the work of God in the Christian life, in the Church, and especially in Grace Lutheran Church. Thanks be to God! God richly and daily provides for all our needs of body and soul. Through ordinary means through an ordinary man such as myself—God's Word continues to be proclaimed and will bear a harvest hundredfold. Such fruitfulness is apparent in the green that we see all throughout the summer. The harvest is ripe and ready for picking. There are harassed and helpless sheep who will be shown our Lord's compassion and brought into His kingdom. At all times—in season and out of season—the Word of God is preached by ordinary men into the mundane lives of sinners.

I look forward to serving as your Pastor in the years to come. God is continually working in our midst, and He will forever sustain us in His Word and faith until we die. Thank you for welcoming my family to Smithville and for going above and beyond to provide for us. We are humbled by your hospitality and grateful for the Lord's fruitful and abundant gifts. Thank you!

<u>Christ-Centered Materials for Hmong Language School and Outreach -</u> <u>\$70,208</u>

St. Paul Hmong Outreach Ministries in Merced, California, has been actively involved in outreach to Hmong communities in their native tongue for 15 years. In 2015 and 2018, Hmong language schools were founded. They are connected with host churches, St. Paul Lutheran in Merced and Redeemer Lutheran in Fresno, California. Through the schools and outreach at New Year's festivals, the Gospel is being heard and families are being baptized and confirmed. Funds will be used to continue mission programs, develop new training modules, and support training implementation of Christ-centered educational materials in the Hmong language to be used in the schools, for festival outreach, and to share with other LCMS churches and districts.

May 2023 NEWS FROM BECKY BARTELT Serving the Lord in Taiwan/Asia Ascension Day Music Recital



May was a busy month organizing and preparing for our Ascension Music Recital. Dr. Robert Rhein and his wife Deaconess Sandra Rhein were in town on their way to teach in India and Sri Lanka, so we organized a music recital to share music and introduce Ascension Day to the community. I had a lot of help. Julie (Jupei), the office administrator, translated and formatted a beautiful program which is pictured on the left. Ruth Wu, who has an MA in music from St. Catherine's in St. Paul, MN, is the local pastor's wife. She performed, helped me think through organizational guestions, invited people and helped with proofreading the Chinese part of the program. Pastor Wu served as translator for the program and also welcomed the audience and introduced them to Ascension Day. Sam Borgwardt, the regional business manager, translated Pastor Wu's welcome from Chinese into English. Caleb Ferry, the regional director's son, sang two solos and a duet. Helen Wu, Ruth's daughter, performed a flute solo. Many friends from church participated in the children's choir and the adult choir. Rob and Sandra Rhein performed a piano solo, a flute sonata and accompanied several pieces. I got to sing two duets and a solo and conduct the choirs. It was very good to be able to work with choirs again, even for a short time. I was

pleased that my Chinese teacher and a student/friend of hers were able to attend and we went out for dinner afterwards. It was a fun event and a joy to share and introduce Ascension Day through music.

Chinese Lessons:

This month I was only able to get my Chinese teacher three days a week due to her schedule. So, I asked two friends to help me with other aspects of Chinese. Barb Rebentisch serves as a liaison for missionaries who need help navigating daily life in the Chinese language. She also translates the services on Sunday mornings. Barb has been helping me to learn "church words". So far, we've worked on some of the words of the liturgy. Ruth Wu has been tutoring me in "music words" since one of the goals for Taiwan is to start a music conservatory teaching and educating about Western music and sacred music, both of which are of interest to many in Taiwan, as well as exploring sacred music with the local churches. Starting in June I will have lessons five days a week again. I am hoping also to find a way to study some kind of music (singing or an instrument) in Taiwan either this summer or in September. By the way, the picture on the right (a half note in English) is called an erfen yinfu. (二分音符)



A Prayer Request and Encouragement:



This May my sister, Sarah Lindau, had her first colonoscopy at age 46. (They recently changed the recommended age for the first colonoscopy from 50 to 45.) They discovered a large polyp/tumor which will have to be removed surgically along with a section of the large intestine. I am so thankful to God that as of now no cancer has been discovered. The doctor said that had she waited until 50, there is a very strong possibility it would have developed into cancer. Praise God for the earlier colonoscopy. While checking for cancer they discovered that she needs to have a hysterectomy at the same time as she has the colon surgery. Please keep her and her family in your prayers. She will have the surgery the end of June and will need several months to recover. For those of you who are wondering, yes, I have had a colonoscopy and I strongly encourage you to do the same if you are over 45. Thank you for your prayers and please let me know if there's anything you would like me to lift up in prayer.
