2019

This year, Ash Wednesday falls on March 6. This observance marks the beginning of Lent, the season in the Church Year that leads up to the celebration of Holy Week, Good Friday, and the Resurrection of Our Lord. Here are a few thoughts to help us use this holy time in all of its fullness so that our faith in Christ may grow stronger.

First, the season of Lent is a time of repentance. Ash Wednesday is a vivid portrayal of this. As we receive an ashen cross upon our foreheads, we hear these sobering words: “Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.” During the forty days of Lent, this remembrance is brought into sharp focus. On our own, we are sinners and enemies of God. On our own, we commit sins of thought, word, and deed. On our own, we do evil and neglect good.

The focus on repentance during Lent is not meant to drive us to despair, however. We do not recall our great sin that we might wallow in self-pity. No, we recall our great sin so that we would turn toward our even greater Savior, Jesus Christ. The Gradual appointed for the season of Lent, taken from Hebrews 12, is a fantastic reminder: “O come, let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.”

The color violet, which is used for the paraments during Lent, is a good reminder of this as well. On the one hand, violet is a color of repentance, inviting us to mourn over our sins and turn from them. At the same time, violet is a color of royalty, inviting us to turn to Christ our King who has sacrificed Himself on the cross for our forgiveness.

Second, the season of Lent is a time of preparation. The readings, hymns, and customs of Lent prepare our hearts to receive Jesus’ resurrection with great joy. For example, during the

season of Lent, we do not sing the hymn of praise “This is the Feast” during the Divine Service. We also refrain from the word “Alleluia,” a Hebrew word that means “Praise the Lord!” By omitting these joyous responses for a time, we prepare with faith, hope, and anticipation for the celebration of our Lord’s resurrection when these words will leap with full joy anew.

Third, the season of Lent is a time of devotion. As we recall the ultimate devotion that Jesus showed for us in His suffering, death, and resurrection, we are filled with devotion for Him. There are various ways this devotion expresses itself during the season of Lent. We have extra worship services on Wednesday evenings to spend more time hearing the Word of God, this year focusing on the Ten Commandments. Some Christians fast during Lent, perhaps by giving up one meal a week or by giving up a favorite item or practice. At those times when the meal or the item is missed, the intent is to fill that time with prayer and study of God’s Word. Many Christians also engage in sacrificial giving during Lent, something above and beyond what they normally present as offerings. At Grace, we do this by designating our midweek offerings for different missions and ministries beyond the congregation’s general fund.

I encourage you to take advantage of these extra opportunities during the season of Lent so that, connected to Christ and His Word, your faith in Him grows stronger. In these ways, Lent will be a great blessing to you. Repent of your sins. Remember your Savior’s love. Renew your devotion to Him. God grant it for Jesus’ sake!


No sewing talent needed.

Reviewing the Past; Looking to the Future

As of February 3rd, our family will have served on the mission field for three years. It has been a delightful whirlwind of service to the Church.

Regularly I stop and marvel that I have been asked to serve in this way and that you all have supported us in this work.

For this article today, I want to review the last year and look ahead to the next.

We originally moved to Hong Kong in February of 2016. January of 2018 found us busily packing and preparing to move the regional office to Taiwan.

At the time, our interim regional business manager and his family had joined us in Hong Kong, and we enjoyed getting to know them as we moved to Taiwan.

Most of the first three months of the year were filled with acquiring visas, cleaning up and disposing of materials at the office space, and travels to Taiwan to check on housing for the family.

In the midst of these plans, I made a short trip to India. Our partner church seminary had been hit by a cyclone and we went to collect pictures and information about the devastation.

As a family, we said goodbyes to dear friends, got rid of family pets, sold furniture, and prepared our goods to be packed into a shipping container bound for Taiwan.

On April 1st, we moved to Taiwan and the process of adjusting to the culture began again. As we have reflected on our life in Taiwan, we have agreed that Hong Kong provided a good transition stage.

We love Taiwan. We prefer the slower pace of life in Taiwan.

Almost immediately, Eliza and the children started Chinese class, and they will continue class until we return to the United States in April for home service.

The summer kept me busy in preparing the new regional office to greet the workers of the Asia region for a workgroup meeting in the fall.

Also, this summer, I picked up the additional title of "Witness Team Manager." It gives me extra opportunities to serve our Asia team and ensure they are able and equipped to do the work Christ has called them to do.

This summer also brought to fruition a two-year project. In cooperation with the web team that works in St. Louis, we developed and deployed a website dedicated solely to the work of the LCMS around the world.

This coming year promises to provide many opportunities to fill up that website with stories, pictures, and videos of the work going on in the Asia region.

In October, I made a short fundraising trip to the US. Since we missed the normal two-year home service due to our move, I wanted to connect with some donors in the middle of the year before doing a full home service this coming spring.

In March, all of the international communications workers will travel to our regional office for additional training. I will help accommodate them and both support and participate in the training.


