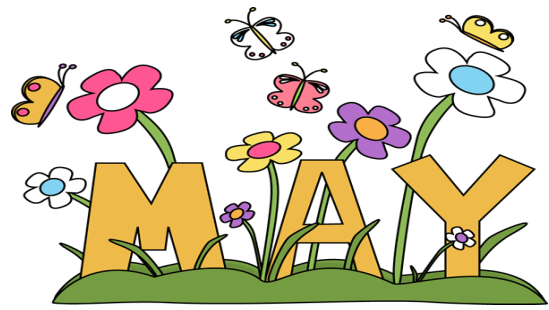


Grace Notes



2021

Forty days after His resurrection, Jesus ascended to the right hand of God the Father Almighty. We confess this truth every week in the Creed, and yet, sometimes our Lord's ascension gets overlooked when we consider His work of our salvation on our behalf. We celebrate His birth at Christmas with great joy, we contemplate His suffering and death during Lent with great reverence, and we hail His resurrection on Easter with glad shouts of "Alleluia!" All of that is meet, right, and salutary. However, if we neglect our Lord's ascension, we miss out on the great comfort, peace, and joy that Jesus intends us to have. I invite you to consider with me for a few minutes the great gift of Jesus' ascension.

First, Jesus' ascension means that He is present with His Church. That may seem like a strange statement at first; after all, when Jesus ascended, His apostles stared up at the sky for a while in a vain attempt to see Him (Acts 1:9-10). Yet Jesus does not withdraw His presence by His ascension; instead, He transforms His presence. Remember the comforting promise Jesus gave His Church: "And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). Jesus' ascension means that He has kept His promise. The right hand of God the Father Almighty is not a physical location; it is a position of authority. Because Jesus sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty, He has the authority and the ability to keep His promise to be present with His Church in His Word and Sacraments until the end of the age.

Second, Jesus' ascension means that our Brother reigns over all creation. Consider what St. Paul writes in Ephesians 1:20-23, "[God] raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come. And He put all things under His feet and gave Him as head over all things to the church, which is His body, the fullness of Him who fills all in all." Clearly, this text teaches us that Jesus reigns with almighty power over


absolutely everything. Now remember: who is this Jesus? He is your Brother (John 20:17). He is your Friend who gave His life for you (John 15:13). He is your Prince of Peace who still bears the scars that mark Him as your crucified and risen Savior (John 20:19-20). He is your Great High Priest who sympathizes with you in your weakness and intercedes before the Father on your behalf (Hebrews 4:14-16). Jesus' ascension gives us the great comfort that, even in the midst of this world's turmoil and upheaval, our Brother is the One who reigns over all things for our good.

Third, Jesus' ascension means that He will return to take us to the eternal home He has prepared for us. When the disciples stared into the sky in vain to catch a glimpse of Jesus, God graciously sent His angels to tell them to stop it: "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven" (Acts 1:11). Already at Jesus' ascension, Jesus' disciples are directed to look for His return. So it remains for you and for me. In John 14:1-3, Jesus promises, "Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me. In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also."

All of this and more is the comfort, peace, and joy of Jesus' ascension. We do well to recall it with the same devotion as we recall His birth, suffering, death, and resurrection. This year, Ascension Day is Thursday, May 13; as is our congregation's custom, we will have a worship service at 7 PM. If you've never joined us before, I encourage you to do so this year as we rejoice together in the ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ!

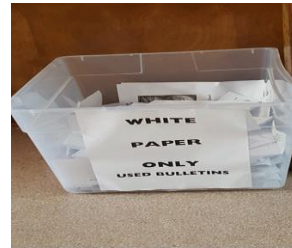

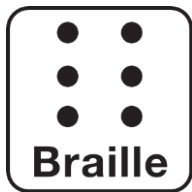

Family Sunday School

Family Sunday School continues at Grace! Please join us after the 11:00AM service each Sunday to learn and rejoice in the Word of God together as the family of Jesus here at Grace! This class is intended for anyone and everyone; whether you are single or married or have lots of kids or have no kids, you are welcome to join us to learn God's Word together. Tables are spaced appropriately throughout the parish hall, with one family per table. Pastor introduces a new Bible story each week, and our learning includes both activities done as individual families and as a large group. We also include a hymn and a craft each week. We finish about 11:45 am. Please join us to learn God's Word together as families and as a congregation!



Ongoing Worship Services at Grace

As of Sunday, March 7, we have transitioned back to one worship service at 10:00 AM on Sunday mornings. Here are some important details:

- Appropriate distancing will be maintained by making use of our entire facility. In addition to continuing the practice of roping off pews in the sanctuary, the balcony and parish hall will both be available. Some chairs will be set up ahead of time in the parish hall in those places that allow for the best view of the sanctuary, but you may also choose to use the rest of the parish hall to sit farther away, according to your preference. You will still be able to hear, receive the Lord's Body and Blood, and be together with your brothers and sisters, even at a distance.
- When you arrive at church, please go in an expedient manner to your seat and remain there, as much as you are able. Similarly, when you leave, please avoid lingering in the narthex and other common areas as much as possible.
- Please continue to wear a mask or face-covering to worship and throughout as much of your time at worship as possible, both in accordance with recommendations from health authorities and especially out of our love for each other as fellow Christians, knowing that others may have greater risk or concern.
- For the time being, family Sunday school will continue to be offered after worship in order to continue to allow for appropriate distancing, both in Sunday school and as people are coming and going to and from worship.

Please note that this plan is subject to change based on the continuing conditions of the pandemic and feedback from you. We welcome your questions, comments, and concerns as we return to one worship service; please be in touch with any member of the Board of Elders or with Pastor Appel. We ask for your patience and prayers as we move once again to worshipping all together as a congregation.
