

Grace Notes



November brings with it the end of the Church Year. As another Church Year comes to a close, the Scripture readings, prayers, and hymns draw our attention to Christ's promised second coming. We confess it each week in the Creed: "From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead." This Day is the hope of every Christian, and so it is good and right that we spend time this month reflecting on the joy that God's Word gives us in the second coming of Jesus.

First, God's Word plainly says that Jesus' return is imminent; He is coming soon (Revelation 22:20) at a time known only to the Father (Matthew 24:36). God's Word uses images such as the suddenness of Noah's flood (Matthew 24:37), a master who comes home sooner than expected (Matthew 24:50), a bridegroom who comes later than anticipated (Matthew 25:5), and a thief in the night (1 Thessalonians 5:13). No person can ascertain how much closer we are to Jesus' return based on current events. God is not waiting for a certain ruler to arise in the modern nation-state of Israel; God is not waiting for a certain war to take place or a certain currency to gain acceptance throughout the world. The world has been in the last days since the moment of Jesus' ascension. Already on the Day of Pentecost, St. Peter preached from Joel 2 to announce to the people that the last days had arrived (Acts 2:16). St. Paul tells St. Timothy in both epistles written to the young pastor that they are living in the last days (1 Timothy 4:1; 2 Timothy 3:1). St. John says quite clearly: "Children, it is the last hour" (1 John 2:18). Every Christian throughout history should have the same urgency. Right now, you and I are living in the last days. Jesus will come at any moment, perhaps before I finish writing this, perhaps before you finish reading this.

Second, because Jesus comes unexpectedly, God's Word gives this simple command in multiple places and multiple ways: "Be ready." Jesus says in Matthew 24:42, "Stay awake." He says in Matthew 24:44, "Be ready." He says in Matthew 25:13, "Watch." He says in Mark 13:33, "Be on guard." What does it mean to be ready for Jesus' return? He is the One who makes us ready. Jesus' makes His Christians ready through faith. This faith worked by the Holy Spirit trusts that Jesus is the only Savior, the One who has saved them through His perfect life, death, and resurrection, given through the water and Word of Holy Baptism. St.

Paul writes concerning the Last Day in 1 Thessalonians 5:9-11, "For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us so that whether we are awake or asleep we might live with him. Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing."

Finally, Jesus' return is a day of great joy for Christians. Judgement Day gives joy to Christians because we know how God has judged us; we know that God has already judged us. God has declared us righteous in His Son Jesus Christ. This verdict was not rendered based on anything we have done, but solely based on what Jesus has done for us. Our works according to the Law will not and cannot save us (Romans 3:19-20), but Jesus' works according to the Law can and do save us (Galatians 4:4-5). By His grace, God has judged us righteous on account of Christ. This verdict has been declared personally to each Christian, to you and to me, when God spoke His name over us in Holy Baptism (Romans 6:1-11). Because God has already judged us righteous by grace through faith for the sake of Christ, the Last Day is a Day of joy for Christians. On that Day, He will raise us from the dead in resurrected bodies and souls. He will publicly declare the verdict He has already spoken, and He will take us to live with Him in eternity. That is day of great joy for us as Christians, our ultimate hope. For that reason, we pray with the Church throughout history: "Come, Lord Jesus! Come quickly!"

Ongoing Worship Services at Grace

In order to continue to receive the gifts of God in the Divine Service together at Grace, all the while protecting the physical health of our neighbors during this time of pandemic, the following plan has been put in place by our elders for the coming weeks:

- Two worship services will be offered each Sunday, one at 8:30 AM and one at 10:00 AM. Each week, you will need to sign up for your desired service ahead of time, either by using the online tool sent by e-mail and posted on Facebook or by calling the church office.
- We will practice social distancing throughout the sanctuary. We will skip every other pew in the first service, and then switch the pews for the second. Households will sit together, leaving at least 6 feet of space between other households.
- Families will be ushered forward one at a time for the distribution of the Sacrament. Rather than kneeling at the rail, this will take place immediately in front of the chancel, in a method similar to what we use during our service before the bazaar. Individual cups and the chalice will both continue to be offered; the purificator, used to wipe the chalice, will be soaked in a neutral spirit with extremely high alcohol content in order to sanitize the chalice between communicants
- Commonly touched surfaces will be sanitized between services.
- The assisting elder and I will wear masks during the distribution of the Sacrament. In accordance with current city and state ordinances, those who come to in-person worship should wear a mask or other face covering.
- Previously implemented health-conscious practices will be continued. The service will be printed fully in bulletin so you will not need to use the hymnal. We will forgo the passing of offering plates, the sharing of the peace, and handshakes during greeting. Please enter the church through the doors that open to the parking lot (these will be held open for you), and avoid going into the parish hall. We will also avoid congregating in the narthex.

Opportunities to Receive God's Gifts Individually

For those who are not yet attending in-person worship, opportunities to receive the gifts of God through other means continue to be available. Please be in touch with me to let me know how I can deliver these gifts of God to you. Even in the midst of a pandemic, no Christian should go without God's gifts in Word and Sacrament. Options include, but are not limited to:



- Live stream the 10:00 AM service on our Facebook page
- Individual appointment to receive Jesus' Body and Blood at Grace
- Socially distant outdoor home visit to receive Jesus' Body and Blood

National Mission Grant Bulletin Bytes:

-God’s Grace for This Generation (\$100,000)

LAMP Ministry Inc. has ministered for nearly 50 years in northern Canada where many villages are reachable only by aircraft or seasonal roads. Currently, nearly one million Indigenous people live in these isolated areas with about half of them under the age of 14. The most alarming statistic is that over 15 percent of children and youth will actually take their own lives out of despair and hopelessness. When LAMP goes into these communities with VBS, Bible studies, and personal witnessing, these communities will have access to Christian education for faith in Christ. In order to fulfill their mission of sharing the gospel in the next few years, LAMP will need to expand their staff of full-time missionary pilots to four or five. LAMP will need to recruit and train 100 to 200 more volunteer missionaries committed to serve at least five years. This grant will provide the funds to help LAMP reach their goal.
