

# Grace Notes



## 2021

Our monthly consideration of God's gift of prayer continues this month with the Conclusion of the Lord's Prayer: "For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen."

The explanation given in the Small Catechism focuses particularly on the word "Amen." The Catechism teaches us: "This means that I should be certain that these petitions are pleasing to our Father in heaven, and are heard by Him; for He Himself has commanded us to pray in this way and has promised to hear us. Amen, amen means 'yes, yes, it shall be so.'"

"Amen" is so much more than a word that we throw on the end of our prayers to let everyone know that we've finished. "Amen" is a word of faith. The word "amen" should only be uttered in response to things that we know are true. That's why, for example, it is appropriate to say, "Amen," after a person is baptized or after the pastor says, "This is the Body of Christ for you," and he places the host into your hand. In both cases, you know it is true. You know the person has been received as a child of God in the water and the Word, and you know you are receiving the true Body of Christ in the Sacrament. You know these things to be true because God has promised them, and so you speak, "Amen," with confidence.

The same is true for the Lord's Prayer. You know that the petitions that you have prayed are true and certain because Jesus is the One who gave them to you to pray. The Son of God Himself is the One who has commanded you to pray these petitions to God the Father. For that reason, there is no doubt that God will answer. You know that God wants His name to be holy in your life. You know that God wants to bring His kingdom to you. You know that God wants to accomplish His will for your life. You know that God wants to give you what you need for this life. You know that God wants to forgive your sins and inspire the same forgiveness in you. You know that God wants to keep you safe from temptation. You know that God wants to deliver you from the devil and his attacks.

You know that each of these petitions pleases God because Jesus has given them to you to pray. For this reason, you can speak "Amen" confidently at the end of the Lord's Prayer, knowing that God will hear and answer this prayer for your greatest good.

A brief word is in order concerning the lengthier doxology that we speak at the conclusion of the Lord's Prayer. The words, "For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever" are likely not a part of the inspired text of Matthew 6 or Luke 11, the two places the Lord's Prayer is found in the Bible. These words are likely a very early liturgical response of the congregation to the Lord's Prayer when it was prayed in the Divine Service. That these words have a long-standing use among Christians is evident from the fact that these words are found in the *Didache*, a first-century Christian document that served as a sort of catechism in the early Church. For this reason, it is certainly appropriate that we continue to use them as Christians, even if we need not insist upon their use for the Lord's Prayer to be "legitimate."

The content of this longer conclusion certainly fits the character of the prayer. Our Father in heaven is the King over all creation who has all good gifts under His direction (Psalm 103:2-3). Our Father in heaven is all-powerful to answer our prayers (Ephesians 3:20-21). Our Father in heaven has all glory and receives all our praise (Psalm 113:4-5). These things are true now and forever (1 Timothy 1:17).

I pray that this journey through the Lord's Prayer has been beneficial for you, and I look forward to continuing to explore God's gift of prayer with you through other Scriptural prayers in the coming months. God grant that every time we pray for those things He has commanded and promised that we would utter our "Amen" with complete confidence in Him as our Father who hears and answers us with every good gift.

Dear Member of Grace Lutheran Church,

As you are aware the Board of Education set up an endowment fund several years ago in an effort to help with Christian Education for our youth here at Grace. Also, as everyone is aware we all had to rearrange our lives last year due to Covid. Because of both of these events we have a fund for education set aside in the account for Grace Lutheran at our local bank. This has happened for a few reasons some of which are youth being home schooled last year causing the funds from the Endowment fund to not be allocated last year, and donations from Grace members to a scholarship fund allocated to benefit our youth in their education. The Board decided to keep these funds in our local bank instead of reinvesting back to the endowment fund so that the funds would be easy to access now that school is starting to be back in person.

That said, this is the time of year where we are all looking for a donation source that would give us a tax deduction. We are asking that you would consider donating to the education fund that we have locally so that when our youth are in need of tuition assistance, we would have the ability to access the funds at the time of need. In the Board's discussion of funds, we decided to keep funds locally as they would be secure, with the uncertainty of the stock market and the fact that we only receive funds from the Endowment when there has been interest earned, it was impossible to know if we would receive any funds at the end of the year from the endowment, and or how much would be received. You are always welcome to donate to the Endowment fund at any time as well if that is something you are more interested in.

The endowment fund is set and can only be utilized for educational purposes. Meaning if we ever needed a new building for education or wanted to help build an educational building in our area, we can petition for that money to be used for such an event. We can not just take the money out of the endowment and use it for non-educational activities.

## National Mission Grant Bulletin Bytes:

### Healing the Invisible Wounds of War through Horses Spirit Warrior, Central Maine — \$95,000

Maine is among the list of "least churched" states in the nation. It has only three LCMS churches in the entire state and has only five Veteran Administration Chaplains. Deaconess Kim Slininger was called to Hope Lutheran Church to reach out to the extensive veteran and military community in the Bangor area. Deaconess Kim is herself a disabled veteran, and the Spirit Warrior program is an extension of her ministry. Spirit Warrior is a program that addresses the need to provide pastoral/diaconal care using horses, to those who have stood in the face of evil and have returned. Current traditional therapy does not address the care of the spirit. Many veterans/service members want to connect with God and theological discussions take place while caring for the horses. This grant will provide funding for 58 veterans to go through the program.
