Therefore, we will not fear though the earth gives way,

These words of Psalm 46 often find their way onto our lips and into our hearts at this time of year. At the end of October, we celebrate the Reformation and sing “A Mighty Fortress,” Martin Luther’s famous hymn based on the words of Psalm 46. The Reformation reminds us of the central truth that we are saved by God’s grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone. The words of the LORD in Psalm 46 teach us this. We can be still and know that He is God because Christ is our Savior by grace alone.

At the beginning of November, we celebrate All Saints Day as we give thank to God to those who have gone before us in the Christian faith and now dwell in Paradise with Christ. The words of Psalm 46 teach us that God is our refuge and strength in the midst of moving mountains, roaring waters, foaming seas, raging nations, and tottering kingdoms. This gives us peace, comfort, and hope even as we grieve our loved ones who have died in Christ because we know He is their refuge and ours now and eternally. He takes us to be with Himself when we die and promises to raise us from the grave on the Last Day.

The words of Psalm 46 are fitting for us right now, not only for these reasons, but also for our encouragement as my time as your pastor comes to a close. For more than twelve years, it has been an incredible blessing to serve as your pastor, proclaiming God’s Word to you and administering His means of grace to you. Thank you for receiving these gifts with joy in the Lord and for encouraging me with the Word of God in return. Thank you for sharing your lives with my family and me. God’s Word has been our joy in times of blessing and our comfort in times of sorrow. The Lord Jesus Christ has been our only refuge, and we know that He will continue to be our ever-present help at all times and in all things. God be praised for His grace that saves us through faith in Christ and raises us from the grave on the Last Day to dwell together with Him and with all His saints forever!

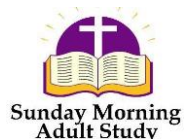
Sunday School

The Littlest and Least of These — \$42,000

St. Paul Lutheran Church and Christian Academy is located in a poor Dallas community of mostly unchurched families and offers the only Christ-centered preschool, before and after school care, and adult academic and Bible classes. The Academy uses Christian books, music, and Bible stories. There are regular devotional services, and families are encouraged to attend worship. St. Paul is outgrowing their current facility after a single year of operation. Going forward, more space is needed for the preschool, nursery, and after-school educational enrichment. The kitchen serving meals needs to be upgraded to a commercial kitchen. The funds will help with these expenses and will allow the Academy to further expand their mission in the community and bring more to Christ.

Voter's Meeting
July 17, 2022

The meeting was called to order by President Bernie Satterwhite.

Pastor Appel opened the meeting with a short devotion concerning Hymn # 598 from "The Red Hymnal" from the section of death and burial. The Red Hymnal has 11 stanzas however the current hymnal only has 3 or 4. He reminded us that the Word of Christ stands forever.

Roll was taken with 27 members and a quorum present.

President's Comments: Bernie Satterwhite stated that we need to look at things strategically and not wait until things break to fix them. We need to figure out what our priorities are. He stated we have been having good meetings and he thanked everyone for their participation on the organ issue.

No new members or transfers.

New Voting Members: Jim Duty made a motion to reinstate Kristin Appel as a Voting member. Tim Wolff seconded, motion carried.

There were no deletions, corrections or additions to the minutes from the April 3, 2022 regular meeting or the Special Meeting held on June 12, 2022. The meetings were approved as submitted.

Tim Wolff verbally reported the Treasurer and Financial Secretary reports.

Trustee Report: none

Elders Report: Charlie Johannessen reported that the Elders have been studying Proverbs in their meetings. They cooked Easter breakfast, with the help of many others, and it was a big success. They have officially transferred Sharon Reinberg's membership to Our Redeemer in Quincy, Illinois.

Pastor's Report/Youth Report: Pastor's report was distributed and read by the Voters, highlighting all the activities that he has been involved in from April 3, 2022 – July 16, 2022, including the funeral of Johnny Schroeder on April 12th and the Confirmation of Baylor Reed Watson on May 1st. He continues to lead worship services at Epiphany in Bastrop the first Sunday of each month as well as attend Congregational meetings and provides weekly assistance to the lay Bible study leader in addition to arranging guest preachers for Christ Lutheran in Loebau as they have a vacancy. He continues to host *Sharper Iron* on KFUE weekday mornings. He informed the Voters that Vicar Gary Johnson will be ordained and installed on July 24th at Zion in Schulenburg and Vicar Joshua Hahn will be ordained and installed at Immanuel in Giddings.

Board of Education: Barb Johannessen stated the Board has decided to transition to Sunday school before church starting the first Sunday in September, with the goal of providing consistency to our youth in the education of our Lord. They seek volunteers to help teach these classes. They are planning a Rally Day for the last Sunday in August. The current Mission Project is Bastrop Pregnancy Outreach Center.

GLLC: Darlene Becker reported the Center has trouble keeping employees. They have put out the Now Hiring sign. They are making adjustments to counter the issue and she asked us to keep Angel Hurst, the Learning Center Director, in your prayers.

LWML: June Parker read a written report stating what the LWML is currently planning and our monthly Mission Projects, including teaming up with the LLL to provide beans for Camp Lone Star at the end of July.

LLL: Jim Duty reported they cooked for VBS and will cook the beans for Camp Lone Star BBQ on July 31st.

Evangelism: They had a float in the Jamboree Parade on April 23 and won a trophy. They also cooked a meal for VBS.

Unfinished Business:

- a. Pat Satterwhite reported on the progress made by the Constitution/By-laws Review Committee. Meetings have been held every two weeks since May to complete this update.

New Business:

- a. President Satterwhite updated the Voters on the issue with the air conditioner unit in the sanctuary. Charlie Johannessen made a motion to authorize Bernie Satterwhite and the Trustees to identify the issues and move forward. Brad Zimmerhanzel seconded, motion carried.

The Voter's closed with the Lord's Prayer.
