2018

In last month's "Ask the Pastor," we began to look at the question, "Why should I go to church?" In September, we saw how the Bible answered the question this way: "I should go to church in order to find rest in the Lord and His Word." This month, we'll see how the Bible answers the question this way: "I should go to church in order to be with fellow Christians."

God never intended for His Christians to be alone. In Genesis 2:18, Moses writes: "Then the LORD God said, 'It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make a helper fit for him.'" God did as He had promised; He gave Eve to Adam so that they would not be alone. In so doing, God created marriage as a gift for one man and one woman for life, He created family as a gift for fathers and mothers and sons and daughters, and He created society as a gift for families together.

All of this comes together in the Church, those who trust in Christ alone for salvation. In the Church, men and women, husbands and wives, sons and daughters, families and friends are not alone. We are together with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. In creating His Church, God never intended for us to be Christians alone. He intended for us to be Christians together.

This was the pattern of worship in the Old Testament. God's people did not simply say their prayers privately. They gathered together at the tabernacle and the temple on regular occasions. Notice how King David rejoices in the gathering of the Church in Psalm 122:1: "I was glad when *they* said to me, 'Let *us* go to the house of the LORD!'" Take a look at Psalm 136. It's not hard to imagine the priest and the congregation singing it responsively verse by verse.

The norm of Christians gathering together for worship continues into the New Testament. Jesus began His ministry by gathering disciples together. Right after Jesus' ascension, Christians were already gathering together for worship. Acts 2:42 is quite helpful: "And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers."

Numerous other passages could be given as conclusive evidence that God's people have been gathering together for worship from the very beginning. Why is this the case? Consider Hebrews 10:23-25: "Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but

encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." Notice how many good things God accomplishes for us by gathering us together as His Church. The Church gathered together is stronger than any individual Christian alone. Gathered together, we are strengthened in our confession of the truth and encouraged for our walk in good works.

Think also of 1 Corinthians 12. Here, St. Paul expounds upon the truth that the Church is the Body of Christ. This very title for the Church indicates that the Church must be together physically. My body won't work all that well if my members are not together physically. The same is true for the Body of Christ. The Church won't function as God intended if the members are not together physically, receiving together the very Body of Christ in the Sacrament that truly unites us together as the Body of Christ. So many passages from this chapter could be quoted here, but verse 26 is particularly full of comfort: "If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together."

So many in our culture seem to think that they can make it alone. Christians have not been immune from applying this worldly thinking to their Christian faith, imagining that Christianity is all about "me and Jesus." However, that isn't the picture of Christianity that the Bible gives. To be a Christian isn't just you and Jesus. To be a Christian is to be with Jesus as a member of His Church—and what great blessing there is for us in the Church! Here we gather to be joined together by Christ's Body as members of His Body who strengthen and encourage one another both in sorrow and joy. We need each other as members of the Body of Christ. That's why we should come to church!


In the Hospital


