2019

The month of October provides multiple opportunities for Christians to give thanks to God for the lives of His people throughout the ages. Here are three important dates to highlight from the Church Year.

On October 18, the Church celebrates the feast day for St. Luke, Evangelist. Luke is best known among Christians as the author of two books in the New Testament: the third Gospel, which bears his name, and the Acts of the Apostles, the sequel to the Gospel that shows how Christ continued His work in the early Church. From Acts, we learn that Luke was a traveling companion of Paul during his second missionary journey, in which they brought the Gospel into Europe (Acts 16:10ff). Luke probably stayed behind in Philippi for some time before rejoining Paul again at the end of his third missionary journey (Acts 20:5ff). Luke also later accompanied Paul to Rome (Acts 27:1ff). During these travels, especially during his time in Jerusalem and Caesarea, Luke did detailed research for his Gospel, speaking to eyewitnesses of all that Jesus did and said in order to record it for Theophilus and for all Christians. (Luke 1:1-4) In Colossians 4:14, we learn that Luke worked as a physician. On October 18, read through Luke 15 and give thanks for St. Luke who proclaimed Jesus as the One who seeks and saves the lost.

On October 23, the Church celebrates the feast day of St. James, brother of Jesus and martyr. There are many men named James in the New Testament; this James is not one of the twelve apostles, but one of Jesus' half-brothers (Galatians 1:19) born after Jesus' virgin conception and birth. Along with the other relatives of Jesus, James did not believe in Jesus until after His resurrection (John 7:3-5; 1 Corinthians 15:7). After becoming a Christian, James became a leader in the early Christian church, serving as a prominent pastor and bishop in Jerusalem (Acts 15:12ff). This James is the likely author of the epistle bearing his name in

the New Testament. According to the Jewish historian Josephus, James was martyred in AD 62 by stoning. On October 23, read James 1 and give thanks for God's gift of faith in Jesus that is active in love toward others.

On October 28, the Church gives thanks for two men, as we celebrate the feast day of St. Simon and St. Jude, Apostles. In the lists of the apostles in the New Testament, these two men are listed tenth and eleventh. Simon is known as the "Zealot" or the "Cananaean," and Jude was also called "Judas son of James" and "Thaddaeus." Jude is mentioned in John 14:22 as asking Jesus how He will show Himself to the disciples and not the world. Although these two apostles do not figure prominently in the narrative of the Gospels, they are remembered among the apostles as those who witnessed the ministry, life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Simon and Jude are remembered together because early Christian tradition suggests that they traveled together as missionaries to Persia, where they were martyred. On October 28, read John 14 and give thanks for Jesus who welcomes apostles and saints together in the place He has prepared for all those who trust in Him.

This month also includes the notable celebration of the Reformation (October 31), which we will celebrate on the Sunday immediately prior (October 27). Please also remember to take a look at pp.x-xiii in *Lutheran Service Book* to find more saints to remember during the Church Year. As you do so, spend time reading God's Word concerning these faithful Christians. I pray that the Lord richly blesses you through the accounts and examples of these faithful men and women, saints whom He has forgiven by His blood.

Recovery in India Continues

In March 2018, I wrote about a cyclone (hurricane in India) that demolished the seminary of our partner church in India, the India Evangelical Lutheran Church (IELC).

Concordia Theological Seminary, Nagercoil, began recovery efforts immediately. They received a grant from LCMS Disaster Response and began rebuilding.

This month, I traveled to India with the Rev. Dr. Ross Johnson (director of LCMS Disaster Response), the Rev. Dr. Edward Naumann (theological educator to Southeast Asia), and the Rev. Dr. Detlev Schulz (professor at Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Indiana).

Our purpose was twofold: to see the repairs and to gather for a Pastor's Refresher Course (PRC). The PRC is an annual conference held at the seminary for all the pastors of the IELC.

The IELC has not been able to gather for a PRC in over 12 years. This recent gathering showed the great unity these pastors had as they listened to teaching from Johnson, Naumann, and Schulz.

We also gathered to see the repairs performed at the seminary. The Rev. Dr. Christudas (principal of CTSN), the Rev. Dr. Sam Thompson (professor and project director), and the rest of the seminary faculty showed us the campus and the work they had done.

Naumann, Johnson, and Schulz dedicated a number of repaired or rebuilt rooms and buildings, and gave thanks for the Lord's work.

If you want to hear more about what's been done so far, please listen to the LCMS Asia podcast (lcmsasia.fireside.fm). On episode 28, I interviewed Dr. Thompson about the project and future directions for the seminary.

Only by His grace, mercy and forgiveness do we find contentment and peace in our full hands becoming fuller. And it is His blessing that the six children we already have are excited to fill their full hands with another baby.
