2021

Our monthly journey through God’s gift of prayer continues this month into the 6th and 7th Petitions of the Lord’s Prayer: “And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.” These petitions go together and build off each other, but they also each have their unique emphases. Let’s consider the pictures each petition puts into our minds as we bring these requests to our heavenly Father.

When Jesus directs us to ask our Father to “lead us” in the 6th Petition, He brings to mind the picture of a path. The words of the LORD from Deuteronomy 30:15 come to mind: “See, I have set before you today life and good, death and evil.” Which way will you walk? In our sinful natures, we would only choose the path of death and evil. That’s how St. Paul puts it in Ephesians 2:1-2: “You were dead in the trespasses and sins in which you once walked.” Only when God in His grace brings us His salvation through faith in Jesus do we begin by His help to walk in the good works that He has prepared for us (Ephesians 2:8-10).

That’s why it’s so necessary to pray the 6th Petition for God’s guidance along His narrow path (Matthew 7:13-14). He promises that He does not tempt us (James 1:13), but in His testing of our faith and in His disciplining us as sons (Hebrews 12:7-11), God seeks to draw us closer to Him and produce steadfastness that leads to eternal life (James 1:2-4). The devil, on the other hand, would use such moments to cause us to question and doubt God’s love and good purposes for us (Genesis 3:5); our enemy proves himself to be the tempter (John 8:44). He, along with the world and our own sinful natures, would try to lead us away from Christ into false belief, despair, and other great shame and vice. Therefore, we pray the 6th Petition regularly, asking our heavenly Father to direct us away from the wide path that leads to destruction and instead to lead us on His narrow road that leads to salvation in the death and resurrection of His Son, Jesus.

The 7th Petition connects closely to the 6th Petition with the conjunction, “but”: “Lead us not in this way, dear Father, *but* instead, deliver us.” Notice how the picture changes here. Now our Lord Jesus brings to mind the picture of rescue. How well have we followed along the path God has set before us? Isaiah 53:6 puts it bluntly: “All we like sheep have gone astray; we have

turned—every one—to his own way.” On top of that, the world and the devil lie in wait to attack us as we walk through this life: “Behold, the wicked bend the bow; they have fitted their arrow to the string to shoot in the dark at the upright in heart” (Psalm 11:2). When we fall into the pit of our own sin or face enemies who are stronger than us, we don’t simply need guidance; we need rescue. That is precisely what the LORD gives; He redeems our lives from the pit (Psalm 103:4).

In this way, the 7th Petition summarizes everything else in the LORD’s prayer. The evil one would do all that he can to keep from us the spiritual and physical blessings for which we pray in the Lord’s Prayer, and so we pray in conclusion that the Lord would rescue us from every evil the enemy intends against us. This does not mean that evil never attacks us as Christians; far from it. Rather, we ask that God would work even this evil for our good (Romans 8:28), that He would remain with us as we suffer evil (Psalm 23:4), and that no matter what evil attacks, God would keep us in the saving faith (Revelation 2:10).

That gives this final petition an eternal perspective, for we know that the Lord’s rescue does not come finally in this life, but in the life to come. When we pray for God’s rescue from evil, then, we are praying for a blessed end. Our Father grants us a blessed end when we die in the Christian faith and He takes our souls to live with Christ in peace and joy (2 Timothy 4:18), and our Father grants us a blessed end when He sends His Son on the Last Day to raise us from the dead and take us to our eternal home (1 Corinthians:15:54-57).

See just how necessary these two petitions are for us as Christians, perhaps now more than ever! “Dear Father, guide us along the narrow path of faith in Jesus Christ, and rescue us from every evil enemy until finally You bring us into eternal life. Grant it for the sake of Jesus! Amen.”

National Mission Grant Bulletin Bytes:

Deaconess Ministry Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch – \$81,680

The mission of **Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch** is to help at-risk children and their families succeed in the name of Christ. The Ranch provides unparalleled care, expertise, and presence in the name of Christ to keep today's troubled kids from becoming tomorrow's troubled adults. Recognizing the need to minister directly with the victimized boys and girls, the Ranch called an LCMS deaconess, Kelly Bristow. This role reflects the exact reason why a vibrant deaconess ministry was envisioned for our church body. Deaconess Kelly's work quickly began to bridge many of the gaps that often hinder a child's healing. Nearly all of the female residents and many of the male residents have been traumatized at the hands of a male figure. This simple reality creates immediate trust issues that can be difficult for a child to bridge, especially when dealing with a male chaplain. The Word of God helps to heal the walls of broken trust.
