What is Catechesis?

In September's newsletter article, I discussed the simple truth that since children always model their parents, it's important to consider, at the very least, 1) what kind of behavior they model and 2) what kind of discipline and education they receive. In this newsletter, I want to dive deeper into looking at the *Christian* education ("catechesis") our children ought to receive, and then highlight the dangers or roadblocks that often hinder that education.

When we talk about catechesis, I think it's best to simply think of it as the Christian life. The Church's term for "teaching," Catechesis is the life-giving teaching of our Lord Jesus Christ which accompanies all who are baptized. Since Holy Baptism is described as "new birth" in the Bible, it's appropriate to see Baptism as the beginning of your *life* as a Christian, and catechesis as that which feeds that new life. If your infant doesn't receive milk after birth, they will starve to death. If you don't feed your children God's Word as they grow up, they will starve to death. If you don't eat the life-giving body and blood of Jesus, you will starve to death. Jesus said to the apostles, "Make disciples of all nations, *baptizing* them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, *teaching* them to observe all things I have commanded you..." (Matthew 28:19-20).

You can already see how Catechesis is for the young and old alike. The Church continues this saving work today as her ministers baptize and catechize young and old alike in the Christian faith. Baptism, confession and absolution, the Lord's Supper, the Divine Service, ongoing instruction in the Word, daily prayer, and the fruit of loving service to family and neighbor are all part of the Christian, baptismal life. This life is lived by faith in Christ as we go about our daily tasks in our vocations at home, in society, and in the Church. Living the Christian faith is not merely an "internal thing;" it has very "external things" by which it is confessed and known and sustained. It is about a real faith which is fed and nourished where there is real sin and real sorrow, but real forgiveness and consolation through the Gospel of our dear Lord Jesus Christ. This is what catechesis is all about. All this and more is meant by the word of Jesus: "Make disciples of all nations; baptizing them...teaching them...; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

So, what are the dangers or roadblocks that hinder catechesis? One of the more prevalent perspectives about catechesis is that it primarily only happens during a 2-3 year period when your child is in 6-8th grade. We call it "Confirmation Class." Don't get me wrong: it's a blessing that we have retained and upheld this intensive instruction class as an important (and even necessary!) step in your child's walk with God where they have the opportunity to confess their faith publicly before the Church.

However, having a "Confirmation Class" can unintentionally teach the church that catechesis primarily involves classroom instruction for a certain duration of time. But this is far from the case. Catechesis is much more comprehensive than this. It involves *living* the new life given in Baptism. It involves the actual *doing* of things that Christians will continue to do for the rest of their lives: attend Divine Service, listen to preaching, receive the Lord's Supper, confess their sins, receive absolution, pray, confess their faith, forgive one another, live as husbands, wives, fathers, mothers, children, workers of every kind, etc.

Our Confirmation classes are off to a good start! I ask that you continue to support our future confirmands (young and old alike!) as they grow in the faith and are welcomed into the life of the congregation. I ask that you pray that they may boldly *confess* the faith and *live* as baptized children of God in Christ.

P.S If you're wondering where to start, I recommend using the *Congregation at Prayer* insert in your bulletin as a weekly devotional and catechetical guide for use in your home. The *Congregation at Prayer* unites the congregation around the same sections of the Word of God and Catechism and gives a common language for prayer and meditation on the Scriptures. It centers on the themes established on each Sunday of the church year and reflects on the past Sunday. It helps families and individual Christians in prayer, reading the Scriptures, and learning the catechism by heart. It teaches the congregation to use the Bible, the Catechism, and the Hymnal as daily devotional companions for the Christian faith and life.
